## Notes about Team Assignments

1. The team assignments on the preceding pages will apply to all assignments that involve group activities in ECS 1200 classes.
2. This means that, unless being told otherwise at the beginning of class, teams will sit together so that they can participate in team activities, much of which will go on in the classes or the new ECS 1200 labs.
3. On quiz days, you may sit where you wish.
4. On team activity (work) days, you may be told to go to the ECS 1200 lab area to work, especially when you are working on the semester project.
5. Team assignments are permanent for the remainder of the semester.
6. Team presentations will be made by at least three team members, and presentation tasks will rotate among team members over the various projects.
7. Team members are expected to participate **FULLY** and **EQUALLY** in each project. If a team member is not “pulling his/her share of the load,” it is expected that the remaining team members will report such conduct to the instructor, after which the offender will be lectured, censured, possibly publicly ridiculed, and, most importantly, have his/her grade reduced!
8. Note that 20% of your grade is dependent on class activities and the semester project.
9. Team members are expected to develop an email list and keep in contact with one another. On your first meeting, please develop this list and make a copy. You may have one member make the list and send out an email to the rest with the email addresses.
10. It is usually advisable to have a team member act as “secretary and postman” for a team meeting, with the responsibility to mail out meeting notes to participants. However, all members should have the email list, so that they can communicate with members as needed and take their turn as secretary.
11. Members should meet **REGULARLY**, especially as activity related to the semester project begins to heat up. **IN PREVIOUS PROJECT EFFORTS, THOSE TEAMS THAT COMMUNICATED REGULARLY DID MUCH BETTER ON THE SEMESTER PROJECT!** “Meeting regularly” means meeting **OUTSIDE** of the class time.
12. Teams should **BE PREPARED**. Both for the semester project and for the mini-projects, come to class ready to make your presentations and fully prepared with respect to the assignment. See #11, above.
13. Finally, yes, we are serious about working hard on team assignments. But also, have some fun! Surprisingly (you might think), those teams that not only worked hard but also approached projects with a good sense of humor and determination to enjoy them usually did the best and were the project winners!
