- A Special Issue on "Managing in Ethnic Chinese Communities" edited by David Ahlstrom (Senior Editor and professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong), Shyh-Jer Chen (Guest Editor and professor at National Sun Yat-Sen University), and Kuang S. Yeh (Guest Editor and Vice Minister, Research, Development, and Evaluation Commission, Executive Yuan, Taiwan). A Special Issue Conference was held in Kaohsiung, Taiwan, on December 12–13, 2008, before the main AAOM conference in Taipei.
- Another Special Issue on "Managing Corporate Governance Globally: An Asia Pacific Perspective" edited by Steve Globerman (Guest Editor and professor at Western Washington University), Mike Peng (Editor-in-Chief), and Daniel Shapiro (Guest Editor and Dean, Faculty of Business Administration, Simon Fraser University). The Special Issue Conference will be held in Vancouver, Canada, on October 8–9, 2009. The submission deadline is April 30, 2009. Please submit to http://apjm.edmgr.com.

Next steps

As a scholarly community, we have two next steps. First, submit more high-quality work to publish in *APJM*. On this occasion, let me thank also all authors who have



published in *APJM*. A journal is only as good as its authors. Over the past 25 years, the words of some of the most influential scholars have graced the pages of our journal. They include J. Barney, P. Beamish, M. Bond, C. Chen, M.-J. Chen, X.-P. Chen, G. Dess, J. Dunning, A. Harzing, C. Hill, M. Hitt, G. Hofstede, R. Hoskisson, M. Kotabe, K. Law, J. T. Li, M. Lieberman, Y. Luo, S. Makino, J. McGuire, W. Mitchell, G. Redding, A. Rugman, M. Shaver, O. Shenkar, J. Tan, D. Tjosvold, A. Tsui, R. Tung, A. Van de Ven, M. Wright, and H. Yeung (excluding editors). *APJM* welcomes you to join this distinguished community of scholars.

Second, position your work as part of the conversations/debates taken place in *APJM*. As of today (October 1, 2008), concrete information regarding exactly when *APJM* would be tracked by SSCI is still not available. My discussions with the Springer team suggested that it is very likely that SSCI will have started formally tracking us in 2008. So *APJM*'s first official impact factor (for 2010, which tracks citations published in 2010 to *APJM* papers published in 2008 and 2009) will likely be announced in mid-2011. Therefore, it is imperative that we keep up the momentum by citing relevant and recent papers published in *APJM* in 2008 and 2009, not only in your *APJM* submissions, but also in your other papers appearing in other journals.
